Lea Ann Chen, M.D. is an assistant professor of medicine at the New York University School of Medicine. She completed her gastroenterology fellowship at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, her internal medicine training at the Mount Sinai Hospital in NYC, and her medical degree at the Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis.

Her research is focused on the role of the gut microbiome in inflammatory bowel disease, and her work has been supported by sources such as the American College of Gastroenterology, the Colton Family Scholar award, the New York Crohn's Foundation, and the American Gastroenterological Association-Takeda Pharmaceuticals International Research Scholar Award in Gut Microbiome Research.

Dr. Chen is a member of the NYU Human Microbiome Program and is the President of the New York Crohn's and Colitis Organization (NYCCO), a local consortium dedicated to collaborative IBD research and education. She serves on the editorial board of the journal *Inflammatory Bowel Diseases*, as well as on the steering committee of REACH-IBD, the junior faculty arm of the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation. Dr. Chen has received several distinctions, including the Daniel Ford National Housestaff Research Award, the Salix Fellowship to Leadership Award, and the Sherman Emerging Leader Prize for Excellence in Crohn's and Colitis.
