Description

The Sherman Prize, established in 2016 by The Bruce and Cynthia Sherman Charitable Foundation, recognizes and rewards leading individuals who go above and beyond to make exceptional and pioneering contributions and inspire tomorrow's innovators in the fight to overcome Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis, also known as the inflammatory bowel diseases (IBDs). Every year, the Sherman Prize program awards an Emerging Leader Prize of \$25,000 - and national recognition through a variety of communications - to an individual making impressive contributions early in her or her career and demonstrating strong potential to make an even greater impact in the future.

Eligibility Guidelines

Sherman Prize nominees must live and work in the U.S., having accomplished their greatest achievements within the past decade, with greater emphasis placed on accomplishments in the last few years.

Eligible nominees will have contributed to one or more of the following areas:

- **Patient Care:** Healthcare professionals who provide outstanding and responsive clinical care, and make strides to improve the physical, emotional, and/or psychosocial aspects of treatment.
- **Medical Research:** Medical and research professionals who perform groundbreaking scientific research in pursuit of treatment advances or cures.

- **Public Service and Education:** Healthcare providers, educators and advocates who go above and beyond in support of awareness, education, and patient and public advocacy.
